Key Outcome Metrics

Metric	Why It's Important	How to Track It
Recidivism Rates	Provides evidence of a program's success in decreasing reoffending behaviors.	Observe trends in recidivism over time and see if recidivism is going up or down
Housing at Program Discharge	Stable housing is critical for long-term success and reduced reoffense rates.	Record the time participants take to achieve stable housing during the program and its effect on long term recidivism.
Relapse Reduction Rate	Reflects program effectiveness in sustaining sobriety, a key factor in preventing recidivism.	Monitor numbre of days sober milestones during the program and correlate with recidivism trends.
Employment Rate	Reflects program effectiveness in helping people with stable employment	Monitor number of people entering and exiting the program with stable employment
Cost Per Participant	Highlights program efficiency and value in reducing recidivism compared to incarceration.	Calculate program cost per participant and correlate with recidivism reduction
